FRIENDS OF MABALINGWE LAUNCHED

In December 2019 we reported that the following important steps in the future of game on Mabalingwe had occurred:

- Game management agreements were signed between the game owners and the Mabalingwe land owners on 90% of the 8 800ha of the Greater Mabalingwe determining for the first time in Mabalingwe's rich history. In terms of the game management agreements the terms and conditions upon which game may be kept by game owners on the property were established and determines the roadmap for game for the duration of the agreements;
- The company Friends of Mabalingwe (FoM) that was established to finance the purchase of 50% of the game in Mabalingwe took ownership of the game early in December 2019 – more on those that took up shares in FoM below;
- LUDUM Game Consortium that was established through a joint venture between FoM and Boschpoort Safaris ("BPS" the owner of the other 50% of the game) sprang into action to actively manage the game enterprise part of the game – that is, obtaining the licenses, managing the catching, selling and also hunting of the game;
- LUDUM made its first payment to the land owners in terms of the game management agreements with said compensation to be applied towards the maintenance of the fences.

The FoM shareholding:

All registered land owners were invited to participate in the game purchase through FoM with the initial process closing on 31 January 2020 whereby 294 shares were taken up at a combined value (including the commensurate loan agreements) of R6,174m. The shares are held by:

- 60 shares by MCPA members;
- 56 shares by individual land owners in Mabalingwe;
- 178 shares by the founders of FoM
(Louise Snyman, Ian Wilcocks & Jan Zeederberg)





At the FoM meeting held on 8 February 2020 the share certificates were issued to the new game owners and were the financial position of the new company discussed indicating that after the full game purchase price was paid and the first instalment for the fences been paid it still has a healthy R900 000 in cash reserves. It was also confirmed that FoM and LUDUM have been subscribed with the land owners to an umbrella public liability cover specifically for possible events that may follow from spread of fire, hunting liability and also breakout of animals.

Game management in 2020:

A report on the veldt management was presented at the FoM meeting with extracts also later in this newsletter. The objective of veld management to establish a sustainable habitat for the game and also to make game viewing in Mabalingwe as pleasurable as possible for game viewers.

In turn the game owners have the responsibility to manage the correct type and number of game to fit in with the veldt. To establish an accurate base, under LUDUM’s instruction a game count was conducted in October 2019 (at a cost of R125 000) with the number of the plains game and plans for same in 2020 being as in the table below:

Notes on Table:

- * The Eland have not adapted well to conditions on Mabalingwe.
- ** The number of Nyala given in the game count is in question.

As in 2019, it is planned to reduce the numbers mentioned above as far as practically possible by catching and selling at an auction with the remainder (between 25 and 33% of the game) being part of either a hunting or culling process. Hunting (or culling) will be restricted to specific areas which will be marked and cordoned off and will not take place on weekends – starting at noon on every Friday - or (4-term) school holidays. In general, the hunting/ culling will take place in two 4-week periods before and after the winter holiday period with specific detail to follow. The keen interest shown by prospective buyers to dart kudu rather than hunt them to preserve the genes of some of the Mabalingwe kudu bulls will also be pursued as an alternative to reduce numbers in areas where, by agreement with the land owners, no hunting may take place. The game catching/auction is planned for August/ September of this year with a game count to follow soon thereafter.

The elephant and rhino management plans will be updated in the year by specialists with following actions to be approved by the provincial environmental authority before any steps on the possible reduction of their numbers may be taken. Whilst it is understood that the decision to reduce the numbers of these gentle giants is always an emotional one, it is vital for the conservation of them within the confined space of Mabalingwe.

As in the past, the first option will always be to find buyers, but within the strict conservation requirements of the Provincial authorities a possible buyer cannot be guaranteed.



Plans for 2021:

As for 2020, the game count undertaken at the end of the 2020 winter when the animals can be easily seen from the air will determine the actions for 2021. One of the actions identified for 2021 which to be investigated further will be the construction of structures for passive catching of animals which should lead to a method to reduce the numbers of some of the species without the associated adverse effects of a chopper chasing them or hunting.

In conclusion:

Where 2019 has been all about getting the game management agreements and game purchase agreement in place, 2020 will be the first year that the new game owners will be involved in managing “their game” themselves. This has been planned for many years and will bring a new dimension to owning Mabalingwe property for many which should endure for many years.

NEWS FROM THE MCPA OFFICE...

MAIN GATE UPGRADE

Those who visited Mabalingwe in the last three weeks will have observed the activities at the main road entering Mabalingwe from the R516.

We are planning a brand-new entrance area for Mabalingwe. The final architectural proposals will be submitted within the next couple of weeks, after which construction will start.



SECURITY MATTERS

Security remains one of the focus areas for the MCPA. It is clear from the 2019 statistics that there is a gradual trend from the previous focus in the south up to the north, namely Idwala, Kukama, and Elandfontein. 88% of break-ins occurred in the north in 2019 compared to 20% in 2018. 71% of the break-ins in 2019 were by unforced entry.

In a letter from the Kukama Trustees to its members, the then chairman, Mark Austin wrote:

The security situation at Mabalingwe has changed substantially since the 80 break-ins experienced during 2015. During 2019, 17 burglaries occurred on the total farm of which 11 occurred in the northern area comprising Elandfontein and Kukama. The MCPA have noticed a gradual trend this year from a previous focus in the south up to the north.

The MCPA has established that the criminals operate as syndicates from the Brits area and are very well coordinated. Several criminal cases have been opened but the conversion rate to incarceration is very low.

In analyzing the pattern of burglaries the MCPA have noted that the southern area has 45 houses covered by Videofied. They are of the firm opinion that this system has played an important part in avoiding break-ins but, unfortunately, this is now impacting on our area as criminal activity has migrated to the northern area.

It is important to note that effective security is a layered process ranging from prevention of access into the Mabalingwe Nature Reserve, regular patrolling to deter intruders, tracking of possible intruders, reaction to alarms (all the previous are managed by the MCPA), to individual house security such burglar bars, internal alarms, Videofied, and general awareness (all these latter actions should be managed by homeowners).

SECURITY MATTERS CONTINUED...

The Trustees do not believe that only the responsibilities managed by the MCPA result in a total security solution.

Various situations that have been identified by the security department in to assisting criminals are as follows:

- *Poor key control – contractor staff do move on but if key safe codes are not changed regularly then these people can access a house easily – this could be the source of ‘inside jobs’.*
- *Many thefts are opportunistic where houses are left open or poorly protected – thieves literally walk in and help themselves whilst occupants are braaing outside or sleeping upstairs.*
- *Poor security on doors and windows generally*
- *Lack of alarms or camera systems*
- *It has been known that houses have let contractors stay on the property without MCPA knowledge in order to do work on the houses – these people are free to roam Mabalingwe at night.*

The Trustees and the MCPA are very aware of the criminal activity, but both parties feel strongly that homeowners can also do their part in avoiding this petty theft by installing simple solutions such as burglar bars, alarm systems or Videofied. The Trustees do not subscribe to the fact that the MCPA is wholly responsible for controlling criminal activity. Any increase in prevention strategies, either by the MCPA or homeowners, will have a cost implication. The MCPA is always available to advise homeowners.

A FIRE SEASON TO REMEMBER...

The 2019 fire season was surely one to remember. With numerous fires in the area, the Working on Fire team was regularly kept busy. The Mabalingwe fire team also assisted with fire suppression efforts around Mabalingwe. Due to the extremely high temperatures and dry conditions that were experienced, these fires were more destructive than in previous years and took longer to suppress.

On the 8th of October 2019, Mabalingwe experienced a devastating fire, which was caused by a runaway fire from a neighbouring entity. With assistance from the Mabalingwe fire team, Working on Fire ground crew, Working on Fire Aerial support and members from the community around Mabalingwe, the runaway blaze was brought under control and extinguished.

The rainy season started, bringing a new threat – lightning. There were 4 lightning strike fires on top of the mountains – 3 fires on Vodacom Hill and 1 fire on the “Old Lion Camp” hill. 3 of these were extinguished by the rain and 1 by the Mabalingwe Fire Team with the assistance of Working on Fire.

The Working on Fire team is busy with fire breaks in around Mabalingwe and Serapa and are assisting Cyferfontein with the clearing of their road reserve.

The Mabalingwe Fire team is and will be at the ready for any fires in 2020. Please report any sign of smoke or fire immediately to our control room giving as much information you possibly can.

ECOLOGY REPORT

In October 2019 the MCPA acquired the services of Ekofocus to consult on ecological matters both from an academic and operational point of view. They have recommended a bush control program, including the following:

- areas where the bush is to be completely removed
- areas where follow up control needs to be done
- ideal control methods for each area
- time frame in which this needs to be completed
- recommended use of selective herbicides
- photographic data for future reference

The first areas of focus are Olievenfontein and Rietspruit, where 177 hectares of bush clearance were done in 2019. On their recommendation, the focus will be on the chemical control of re-growth in that area.

Another key area for 2020/21 will be the enhancement of the game viewing experience by clearing 20 meters of bush on the sides of the roads.

Fire remains an important management tool. The MCPA will apply for a permit to do controlled burns in Rietspruit / Olievenfontein (350ha), Bergplaas (160ha), Witland (300ha) and Elandsfontein (213ha). This will be done in October/ November after the first rains, if conditions permit.

FENCE UPDATE

Mabalingwe consists of 45km of game fence. Out of this, 70% of the fence is situated on properties managed by the MCPAm and the balance is situated on entities that do not form part of the MCPA.

To ensure that we adhere to the minimum standards of fence categories for dangerous animals, the MCPA does regular checks on the fence to ensure it is safe and in good repair. In 2019 six kilometers of the fence was upgraded. We plan to upgrade 13km of the fence in 2020. This will mean that 73% of the fence, managed by the MCPA, will be deemed to be in excellent condition - the balance is in fair condition and will be upgraded in 2021.



PROPERTY AGENTS & SERVICE PROVIDERS

Owners are reminded of the following:

Estate Agents & Rental Agents : Owners are free to choose any estate agent to represent them in the sale of their property. Owners are similarly free to choose a rental agent to represent them.

Owners are asked to ensure that the agent of their choice is *au fait* with the rules of the Body Corporate concerned and that they adequately advise potential buyers or renters of the Conduct Rules. Potential buyers should also have the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the Body Corporate's Management Rules.

Contractors and Service Providers : Owners often require the services of contractors for repairs and maintenance purposes. Owners are free to use a contractor of their choice providing that the contractor in question complies with the requirements of our Security protocols. Anyone wishing to know more, can contact the Control Room or Security Manager, Louis Roux.

USE OF KEYPADS AT GATES

Numerical keypads have been installed at a number of gates in Mabalingwe, including Elandsfontein and Idwala. These are for use ONLY in cases where there is no cell signal or for some similar reason the cell system is not working. Owners can press the talk button to be assisted with either the number or opening of the gate remotely by the Control Room. The code will be changed immediately after each outage.

For YOUR and your neighbours security, the code must not be shared with anyone else ever, including contractors and staff - anyone needing access can use the talk key to speak to the Control Room. Abuse of the system will only endanger the security we are working so hard to establish.

Whilst the rainfall received is in line with the average of past years to date, records show that Mabalingwe can receive rainfall in excess of 100mm in February, March and April. Although we believe the dams are already at a level which should see us comfortably through the winter, more rain is needed.

EVACUATION PLAN

Fire remains one of the greatest risks we have on Mabalingwe. Not only does it threaten the loss of grazing and property, but also life. For this reason, we would like to ensure that owners are informed on the evacuation procedure for their specific area.

Method of notification

Owners will be notified in one of the following ways:

- Telephonic notification from the control room
- Mabalingwe staff will go door to door

The assembly point for each area is listed below. Visitors and residents should make their way to the assembly point in a quick but safe manner, taking all due safety precautions.
